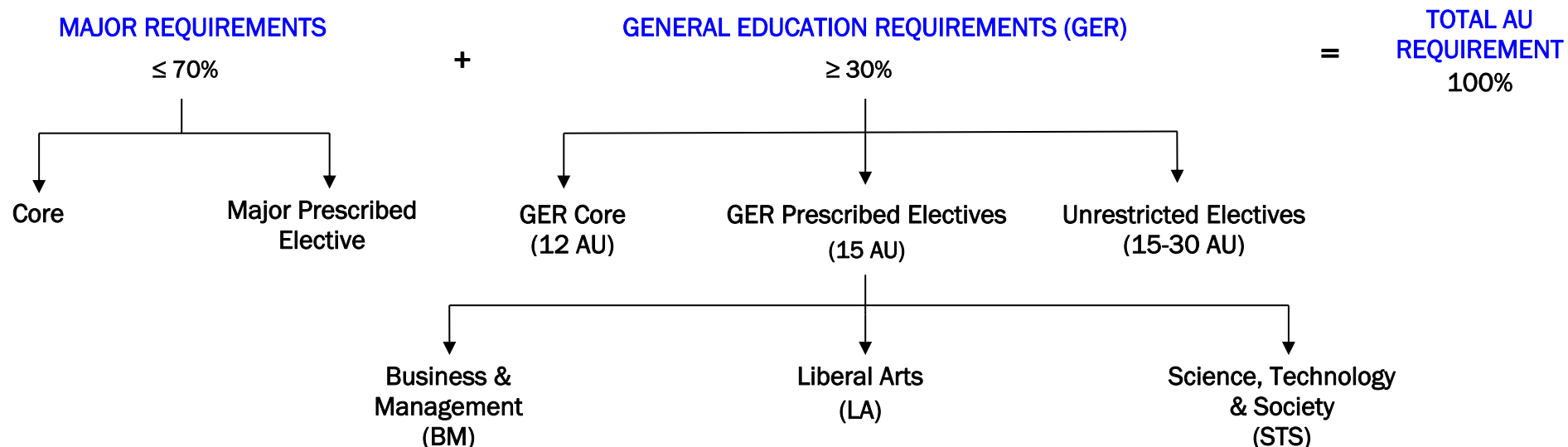


# OVERVIEW OF CURRICULUM STRUCTURE

For full-time students admitted to Year 1 with effect from AY 2014-15

Notes:

1. All percentages are based on the total academic unit requirement. One academic unit = One hour of lecture/tutorial per week or 3 hours of lab/fieldwork per week.
2. Core courses are compulsory courses required to satisfy programme requirements. Major Prescribed Electives are courses for specialisation in a particular degree programme.
3. General Education Requirement is the curriculum requirement for broadening study and is divided into 3 areas of studies as follows:
  - (a) GER Core
    - These are courses relating to:
      - (i) Communication Skills
      - (ii) Singapore Studies
      - (iii) Ethics and Moral Reasoning
      - (iv) Environmental Sustainability
      - (v) Entrepreneurship & Innovation
  - (b) GER Prescribed Electives
    - The courses are categorised into 3 sub-areas of studies relating to:
      - (i) Business & Management (BM)
      - (ii) Liberal Arts (LA)
      - (iii) Science, Technology & Society (STS)
  - (c) Unrestricted Electives
    - These are courses chosen by students to broaden their learning experience. The Unrestricted Electives may cover any area offered by the various Schools. They can also be fulfilled through pursuing minor.
